- CDA is a way of analysing and uncovering bias in written texts, with an emphasis on texts that relate to <u>power</u> <u>structures</u>


Critical Discourse Analysis Norman Fairclough (1980) Combines linguistic theory and social theory to examine ideologies and power relations involved in discourse.

Also, have a look at the 8th page of the Jam board. Do you notice anything about the photos used in the left/right wing articles?


GASLIGHT. (vb) manipulate (someone) by psychological means into doubting their own sanity.

BOOGEYMAN (n)

a person or thing that is widely regarded as an object of fear.

Daily Wire believed that people were creating fake news and laughable fears about Russia.



PARROT (vb)

repeat information mechanically without thought

Brietbart are trying to mock the news outlets that reported this story.



Harassment crusade.

The use of the word "crusade" suggests violence and a religious mindset.



"credibly accused"


This expression is not yet listed in the dictionary.

It means there is evidence that an offence may have happened.

Virulently (adv.)

1.(of a disease or poison) extremely severe or harmful in its effects
2. bitterly hostile

The suggestion is that Trump supporters are infected with a kind of virus
